The lowest bid was received from the Jennite Company of Toledo, Ohio in the amount of \$25,495.

The program will replace sidewalks raised by street trees throughout the City with a large majority occurring along Westcliffe Court. The budget for the program was more than doubled from previous years per Council's request.

The funds are available in fund 501-7440-51250 and the work will be completed this spring. We recommend award of the 2019 Sidewalk Replacement Program to the Jennite Company in the amount of \$25,495.

WHEREAS, the two (2) proposals offered by the above companies meet all of the City's specifications and the Director of Public Service, by report dated March 6, 2019, has recommended acceptance of the lowest proposal submitted by Jennite Company and that the contract for the 2019 Sidewalk Replacement Program be awarded to same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

Dear Mr. Mayor and City Council Members:

In June of 2018 the Ohio Supreme Court conducted a Physical Security Assessment of our Municipal Court building.

One of the concerns addressed was the lack of protection afforded to the clerks due to the open front counter. The report recommends the installation of a barrier and Judge Bonfiglio has requested bullet resistant glass.

We requested quotes form three nearby glass companies to provide Level III Impact Resistant glass. Interstate Commercial Glass & Door submitted the only quote with a cost of \$49,511 to complete the work.

Interstate has been in business for eighteen years in Northwood, Ohio and their company is well-respected. We recommend approval to move forward with this project in the amount of \$49,511 to Interstate Commercial Glass & Door.

WHEREAS, as a result of that assessment, the Ohio Supreme Court recommended that a barrier be installed at the front counter and Judge Bonfiglio has requested impact resistant glass be installed;

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated March 18, 2019, has indicated that quotes were requested from three local glass companies to provide Level III Impact Resistant glass with only Interstate Commercial Glass & Door responding; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, in a report dated March 18, 2019, has recommended that the proposal of Interstate Commercial Glass & Door to provide Level III Impact Resistant Glass at the Sylvania Municipal Court at a cost of Forty-Nine Thousand Five Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$49,511.00), be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

- SECTION 1. That the proposal of Interstate Commercial Glass & Door, to provide and install Level III Impact Resistant Glass at the Sylvania Municipal Court be, and the same hereby is, accepted and approved, and the Mayor and Director of Finance are hereby authorized to evidence the acceptance of such proposal on behalf of this City.

This License Agreement is entered into between Anay Donuts, Inc., d/b/a Dunkin Donuts, Sylvania, Ohio 43560 and the City of Sylvania, 6730 Monroe Street, Sylvania, OH 43560. The purpose of this License Agreement is to permit Dunkin Donuts install and maintain a drive through over public right-of-way. The License Agreement is made subject to the conditions set forth below.

I. ACCESS

1. Dunkin' Donuts shall have access to the area described as

II. SCOPE OF LICENSE

This License Agreement gives Dunkin' Donuts the right to enter onto the property for the following purpose(s):

Dunkin' Donuts shall indemnify the City of Sylvania from any losses, damages, claims or demands of whatever nature which might arise as a result of Dunkin' Donuts' failure to observe any applicable safety, health, and environmental regulations.

V. GOVERNING LAW

The law of the State of Ohio shall apply to the interpretation of this License Agreement and to the resolution of any disputes arising out of the matter set forth herein.

TERM OF LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement shall be effective on March 1, 2019 and shall continue in effect until the City of Sylvania terminates said License.

VII. TERMINATION OF LICENSE AGREEMENT

Either party may terminate this License Agreement prior to the expiration of the term set forth in Section VI above if the other party violates any condition of the License Agreement. Any termination hereunder shall be effective thirty (30) days after written notification to the other party of such termination.

VIII. ASSIGNABILITY







A RESOLUTION OF SYLVANIA CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING OHIO HOUSE BILL 62 AND THE PROPOSED INCREASE IN THE OHIO MOTOR FUEL TAX OF \$0.18 PER GALLON AND URGING REPRESENTATIVE MERRIN AND SENATOR GAVARONE TO SUPPORT HOUSE BILL 62; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania is estimated to receive \$639,000 in the State Fiscal Year of 2020 under the present Ohio Motor Fuel Tax of \$0.28 per gallon; and,
