Minutes of the Meeting of Council April 5, 2021

The Council of the City of Sylvania, Ohio met in regular session via in-person and Zoom on April 5, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Stough in the chair. Roll was called with the following members present: Katie Cappellini, Mark Frye, Doug Haynam, Brian McCann, Patrick Richardson, Lyndsey Stough, Mary Westphal; (7) present; (0) absent.

Roll call: All present.

Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America led by Mr. McCann.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Stough stated that Council will now consider agenda item 3.

APPROVING THE BANNER APPLICATION OF THE SYLVANIA SCHOOLS; AUTHORIZING THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO INDICATE SUCH APPROVAL ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF SYLVANIA; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 19-2000, passed June 5, 2000, granted permission to install banners in the public right-of-way on the Toledo Edison poles located on Monroe Street by Wendy's across to the area in front of Country Squire Plaza (near the intersection of Corey Road and Monroe Street); and,

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 19-2000 provided that the applications were to be reviewed on an application-by-application basis and set forth the criterion on which the applications were to be considered; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 20-2018, passed May 21, 2018, amended Part Eleven – Planning and Zoning Code of the Codified Ordinances of Sylvania, 1979, as amended, by amending Section 1166.07 – Standards for Permitted Signs to permit banners to be installed in the downtown; and,

WHEREAS, Sylvania Schools have submitted a request to hang a banner within said Main Street public right-of-way to congratulate the Sylvania Northview High School and Southview High School graduates; and,

WHEREAS, the banner will hang from late May through mid-June and will comply with all of the terms and conditions set forth in Resolution No. 19-2000 and Ordinance No. 20-2018.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDINANCE by the Council of the City of Sylvania,

Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

- SECTION 1. That the application of the Sylvania School District to hang a banner across the downtown block of Main Street between Maplewood Avenue and Monroe Street is found to comply with Section 1166.07(h)(2)(A)(1) and is hereby approved.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> That the Zoning Administrator is authorized to sign said permit granting permission to proceed under the application hereby approved.
- SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ORDINANCE NO. <u>32</u> -2021

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYLVANIA, OHIO, TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE PURCHASE OF ROADWAY DE-ICING SALT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania (hereinafter referred to as the "Political Subdivision") hereby submits this written agreement to participate in the Ohio Department of Transportation's (ODOT) annual winter road salt bid in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 5513.01(B) and hereby agrees to all of the following terms and conditions in its participation of the ODOT winter road salt contract; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated April 16, 2021, has recommended that the City of Sylvania participate in the State of Ohio contract for roadway deicing salt; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania has participated in the State of Ohio contract for roadway de-icing salt for 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, ____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized to enter into, on behalf of this City, a Purchasing Services Contract with the Ohio Department of Transportation in the form and substance of said "Exhibit A."

SECTION 2. As a participant in this agreement, the Political Subdivision agrees:

- A. To be bound by all terms and conditions established by ODOT in the winter road salt contract and acknowledges that upon award of the contract by the Director of ODOT it shall be bound by all such terms and conditions included in the contract.
- B. The City of Sylvania hereby acknowledges that upon the Director of ODOT's signing of the winter road salt contract, it shall effectively form a contract between the awarded salt supplier and the Political Subdivision.
- C. The Political Subdivision agrees to be solely responsible for resolving all claims or disputes arising out of its participation in the ODOT winter road salt contract and agrees to hold the Department of Transportation harmless

- for any claims, actions, expenses or other damages arising out of the City of Sylvania's participation in the winter road salt contract.
- D. The Political Subdivision's electronic order for Sodium Chloride will be the amount the Political Subdivision agrees to purchase from its awarded salt supplier, which the Director of Service is recommending 2,000 tons at the delivered bid price per ton awarded by the Director of ODOT.
- E. The City of Sylvania hereby agrees to purchase a minimum of 90% of its above-requested salt quantities from its awarded salt supplier during the contract's effective period of September 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022.
- F. The City of Sylvania hereby agrees to place orders with and directly pay the awarded salt supplier on a net 30 basis for all road salt it receives pursuant to ODOT winter salt contract.
- G. The City of Sylvania acknowledges that should it wish to rescind this participation agreement it will do so by written, emailed request. The written, emailed request to rescind this participation agreement must be received by the ODOT Office of Contract Sales, Purchasing Section email: Contracts.Purchasing@dot.ohio.gov by the deadline. The Department, upon receipt, will respond that it has received the request and that it has effectively removed the Political Subdivision's participation request. Furthermore, it is the sole responsibility of the Political Subdivision to ensure ODOT has received this participation agreement as well as the receipt of any request to rescind this participation agreement. The Department shall not be held responsible or liable for failure to receive a Political Subdivision's participation agreement and/or the Political Subdivision's request to rescind its participation agreement.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the City should indicate its participation in the Ohio Department of Transportation's roadway de-icing salt purchasing contract immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE
TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH A HEAD TEACHER,
TEACHERS, AND AIDES FOR THE SYLVANIA SAFETY CITY
PROGRAM BEING CONDUCTED BY THE SYLVANIA DIVISION
OF POLICE; PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFORE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council passed Resolution No. 4-86 establishing the SYLVANIA SAFETY CITY FUND for the purpose of receiving funds for educating the preschool children of this City by initiating and maintaining a high quality safety education program through proper and effective teaching techniques, the name of which fund was, by Resolution No. 29-90, passed November 15, 1990, changed to POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS PROGRAM FUND; and,

WHEREAS, the Sylvania Division of Police, as the lead agency, in cooperation with, and through the support of, the Sylvania City Schools, service clubs, citizens and others, have planned the educational safety program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2019; and,

WHEREAS, attached hereto as "Exhibit A" is a list of the persons and their general duties, with amounts designated for each person for the accomplishment of their respective duties at a total cost of Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00); and,

WHEREAS, agreements for the providing of such services should be authorized and payment therefore should be authorized.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into agreements for the providing of services for the Safety City Program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2021, at a total cost of not to exceed Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00), with each of the persons listed on "Exhibit A" at an amount for each as designated on said Exhibit for each, which written agreements shall be approved as to form by the Director of Law.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they are hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into agreements for the services of persons for the said Safety City Program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2021, and for such substitute and additional persons as the Mayor and Director of Finance may deem necessary, which written agreements shall be approved as to form by the Director of Law, but no agreements shall be made that will exceed the amount currently appropriated for such purpose.

Re: Cushman Road Improvements Project

Additional Tree Removal Compensation – 5824 Cushman Road

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

On September 8, 2020 Council authorized the payment of \$823 to Mr. and Mrs. Larry Duvall for a temporary construction easement and for the loss of a 3" Japanese Maple anticipated with construction operations on the Cushman Road Improvements Project (Ord. 61-2020).

During property owner discussions in July 2020, we noted four (4) additional small trees that could possibly be impacted by construction operations. These trees were located near the back of slope line for a drainage swale, but it was decided to note these trees as "saved" on the construction plans with the hope of being able to grade around them.

The contractor has started rough grading work on the property and it was determined that the four trees cannot be saved. As a result our Parks & Forestry Department was authorized to conduct tree appraisals and they have determined the following compensation values based on species and size:

- 2~3" Norway Maple, \$320 each, \$640 total
- 7" Flowering Cherry, \$340
- 8" Flowering Cherry, \$780

Since these trees are located outside of the permanent right-of-way, the property owner should be compensated for the loss. Therefore, we request approval to compensate Mr. & Mrs. Larry Duvall in the amount of \$1,420 for the loss of the trees. Please call with any questions.

AUTHORIZING COMPENSATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,420.00 TO MR. AND MRS. LARRY DUVALL RELATIVE TO THE CUSHMAN ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, plans for the improvement of Cushman Road in the City of Sylvania, Ohio have been completed; and,

WHEREAS, the project includes re-establishing and re-profiling the front yard drainage swales including flatter and more gradual side slopes to ease property maintenance; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 61-2020, passed by Sylvania City Council on September 8, 2020, accepted a Temporary Construction Easement from Sharon Duvall and Larry Duvall for the improvement of Cushman Road and authorized compensation to Mr. and Mrs. Duvall in the amount of Eight Hundred Twenty-Three Dollars (\$823.00); and,

WHEREAS, the contractor has begun rough grading work on the property and it has been determined that four additional trees on Mr. and Mrs. Duvall's property will need to be removed to complete the project; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Larry Duvall are entitled to receive payment of just compensation representing the fair market value of the four additional trees that will be required to be removed as part of the project for which they will be paid the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1,420.00); and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated April 19, 2021, has recommended that the additional four trees be removed and that Mr. and Mrs. Duvall be compensated in the amount of \$1,420.00 which represents the fair market value of the trees.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas
County, Ohio, members elected thereto concurring:
SECTION 1. That Mr. and Mrs. Larry Duvall should be compensated in the amount of One Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1,420.00) for the additional four trees that need to be removed from their property relative to the Cushman Road Improvement Project.
SECTION 2. That, to provide funds for payment to Mr. and Mrs. Duvall for the four additional trees be removed, there is hereby appropriated from the WATER FUND , from funds therein not heretofore appropriated, to Account No. 701-7525-53501 – Utility Improvements , the sum of One Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1,420.00).
SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.
SECTION 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the improvement of Cushman Road should proceed as soon as possible and accordingly the acquisition of the necessary temporary easements should proceed forthwith and therefore this Ordinance should be effective immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.
