ORDINANCE NO. 48 -2022

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE
TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH A HEAD TEACHER,
TEACHERS, AND AIDES FOR THE SYLVANIA SAFETY CITY
PROGRAM BEING CONDUCTED BY THE SYLVANIA DIVISION
OF POLICE; PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFORE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council passed Resolution No. 4-86 establishing the SYLVANIA SAFETY CITY FUND for the purpose of receiving funds for educating the preschool children of this City by initiating and maintaining a high-quality safety education program through proper and effective teaching techniques, the name of which fund was, by Resolution No. 29-90, passed November 15, 1990, changed to POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS PROGRAM FUND; and,

WHEREAS, the Sylvania Division of Police, as the lead agency, in cooperation with, and through the support of, the Sylvania City Schools, service clubs, citizens and others, have planned the educational safety program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2022; and,

WHEREAS, attached hereto as "Exhibit A" is a list of the persons and their general duties, with amounts designated for each person for the accomplishment of their respective duties at a total cost of Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00); and,

WHEREAS, agreements for the providing of such services should be authorized and payment therefore should be authorized.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, ____ members elected thereto concurring:


SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into agreements for the providing of services for the Safety City Program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2022, at a total cost of not to exceed Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00), with each of the persons listed on "Exhibit A" at an amount for each as designated on said Exhibit for each, which written agreements shall be approved as to form by the Director of Law.

- SECTION 2. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they are hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into agreements for the services of persons for the said Safety City Program for the period beginning and ending in June of 2022, and for such substitute and additional persons as the Mayor and Director of Finance may deem necessary, which written agreements shall be approved as to form by the Director of Law, but no agreements shall be made that will exceed the amount currently appropriated for such purpose.
- SECTION 3. That the amounts payable pursuant to agreements for said services so provided shall be charged to and paid from Account No. 810 7160 1250-Contracts, Safety City.
- <u>SECTION 4.</u> That the Director of Finance of this City be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to draw his warrant or warrants against said account in payment of services to be provided under the agreements hereby authorized in the total sum of the amount appropriated to said account, upon presentation of proper voucher or vouchers therefore, duly approved by the Director of Public Safety.
- SECTION 5. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- SECTION 6. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.
- SECTION 7. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the agreements must be authorized immediately to provide the services required. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

At the February 22, 2022 meeting City Council authorized the Service Department to request Letters of Interest (LOI's) from consultants to provide engineering services for the full-depth pavement replacement and traffic signal replacement project on Main Street between Tenmile Creek and Convent Boulevard (LUC-CR 1572-8.28, PID 111207).

During the solicitation we received LOI's from four (4) engineering consultants. The Service Department reviewed, scored, and ranked all LOI's and selected the Mannik Smith Group as the most highly qualified firm and project team. Subsequently the Service Department entered into scope of services and fee negotiations.

We have completed those negotiations and Mannik Smith has prepared a proposal in the amount of \$107,652 to complete the scope of services.

This is a Local Public Agency (LPA) project with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). As such the Service Department has coordinated the scope of services and fee proposal with ODOT District 2 and both entities are ready to move forward and commence engineering design. This is an appropriated item in the 2022 budget, fund 223-7611-53503.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 10-2018, passed by Sylvania City Council on June 4, 2018, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to submit a grant application for the Main Street Reconstruction (between Ten Mile Creek and Convent Boulevard) Project; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of the project was estimated at \$884,005 and the City was awarded \$400,000 of Surface Transportation Block Grant funding and intends to submit an Ohio Public Works Commission grant application later this year; and,

WHEREAS, Sylvania City Council authorized the Director of Public Service to solicit
Letters of Interest from consultants to provide engineering services for the Main Street
Reconstruction Project at its February 22, 2022 meeting; and,

WHEREAS, this project involves full-depth pavement replacement and traffic signal replacement project on Main Street between Ten Mile Creek and Convent Boulevard; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated May 2, 2022, has indicated that the City received Letters of Interest from four (4) engineering consultants; and,

WHEREAS, following review and ranking of the Letters of Interest, the Director of Public Service, in his May 2, 2022 report, has recommended that the proposal of Mannik Smith Group to provide engineering services for said project at a cost of One Hundred Seven Thousand Six Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars (\$107,652.00), be accepted.

Sylvania River Trail Phase 2 – Elevated Walkway Bearing Seat Repairs

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

On April 12, 2022 the Service Department conducted an inspection on the northern section of elevated walkway near the Phase 2 pedestrian bridge on the Sylvania River Trail. As a result of this inspection, it was determined that further review and recommendation by a structural engineer would be necessary to evaluate the condition of two bearing seats that support the elevated walkway on the pedestrian bridge piers.

The Service Department reached out to DGL Consulting Engineers, LLC, who is the engineer of record and under contract with the City on the Silica Drive Bridge Replacement Project, to visit the site and provide a recommendation. A site visit was conducted on April 15, 2022 and it's been determined that the elevated walkway bearing seats were designed and constructed in a manner that has led to premature deterioration of the seats at two of the four locations. As a result, repair work is recommended to remove the unreinforced bearing seats at all four locations and provide stronger ones that will ensure longevity and safety.

DGL has prepared a proposal in the amount of \$7,800 to determine feasible repair alternatives, consult with local bridge contractors on constructability methods, and engineer a repair design that will be used by bidding contractors. Funds used for this engineering work would be from the capital improvement account 401-7610-53503. We would recommend approval of the proposal in the amount of \$7,800 with DGL Consulting Engineers. There are multiple concrete bridge seats that support the elevated walks, adjacent to the prefabricated steel truss bridge over the Ottawa River, along the Sylvania River Trail. It appears that these concrete bridge seats have been constructed without using reinforced steel. Unfortunately, this has led to significant deterioration and lack of support in some places. It was the consensus of you, Scot and I that repair work is needed, to ensure longevity and safety of this corridor.

It is our understanding that bridge repairs will need to be performed to address the failing/failed bridge seats under the approach walk on the Sylvania River Trail.

The request is to determine what the best repair details are, as well as perform engineering calculations and prepare details for a contractor to perform the repair work. Detailed Scope Information can be found within the attached document.

Re: Update on TIF

We want to give you an update on the status of possibly establishing a TIF in our downtown area.

We met with Glen Grisdale from Reveille and we are working on the following items;

- Glenn will recalculate the projections on what each TIF would collect (10 yr., 30 yr.). He will use 75% in the calculation.
- We will provide him with an update on the TIF map and take out the residential area on Maplewood and include more commercial properties on Monroe Street.
- We will schedule a meeting with the schools to go over the TIF to get an idea on their position regarding a TIF before we come back to you with a final recommendation.
- In our discussion a 30 year, 75% TIF that would be established in 2022 seems the best option, but we want to give you all the information when it is ready so you will then be in a better position to make a decision on this.
