AUTHORIZING LEASE BETWEEN THE CITY OF SYLVANIA, AS LESSOR, AND THE SYLVANIA AREA JOINT RECREATION DISTRICT, AS LESSEE, FOR BURNHAM PARK; DETERMINING SAID CITY OWNED PROPERTY NOT TO BE NEEDED FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES DURING THE TERM OF THE PROPOSED LEASE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO SIGN SUCH A LEASE ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF SYLVANIA; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in 2014, the City and the Sylvania Area Joint Recreation District ("SAJRD")

entered into a Lease Agreement for the operation and maintenance of Plummer Pool and Burnham Park; and,

WHEREAS, SAJRD was recently awarded a grant ODNR has required that the cancellation provision be revised from the language of the original lease and also that the term of the lease be extended to ensure operation of the park for at least 15 years from the grant award; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 54-2022, passed May 16, 2022, authorized a Lease between the City of Sylvania and Sylvania Area Joint Recreation District for Burnham Park; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed revised Lease for Plummer Pool only is attached hereto as "Exhibit A."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are authorized to enter into Lease with SAJRD, in the form and substance of "Exhibit A" attached hereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the Agreement should be authorized immediately to provide for the continued operation and maintenance of Plummer Pool. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

WTINESSETH:

WHEREAS, the CITY is a municipal corporation and a political subdivision duly organized and existing under the constitution and laws of the State of Ohio and a charter adopted pursuant to such constitution and laws; and,

WHEREAS, SAJRD is a joint recreation district duly established on March 28, 1988 and existing under Section 755.14(C) of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio; and,

WHEREAS, the CITY is the owner of certain real estate located on Maplewood Avenue known as Burnham Park and Plummer Pool.

WHEREAS, the City and SAJRD entered a certain Real Property Lease dated January 28, 2014 for Plummer Pool and Burnham Park ("Original Lease").

WHEREAS, the City and SAJRD have determined that it is in the best interests of the parties to enter two separate leases for Plummer Pool and Burnham Park, so that upon the full execution of the Lease and the Lease for Plummer Pool, the Original Lease shall be considered terminated and of no further force and effect without further documentation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises set forth herein, and for and on behalf of their successors and assigns, the parties agree that the CITY hereby leases to SAJRD for recreational purposes as hereinafter set forth, the real estate known as Plummer Pool and described on "Exhibit A," for the sum of One Dollar(\$1.00) per year and other valuable consideration, said premises of value at least equal to that amount, on the following terms and conditions:

1. <u>Purpose</u>. Said property is leased to SAJRD to be operated and maintained for use by the general public for swimming and pool recreation.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Lease was in effect for a period of sixty (60) months from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2018 and one five (5) year extension term was exercised. Thereafter, for 2 successive terms of five (5) years each unless THE CITY, SAJRD or its successor, twelve (12) months prior to the commencement of any said five (5) year terms, shall give to the other written notice of cancellation of this agreement. The written notice to THE CITY shall be addressed and delivered to 6730 Monroe St., Sylvania, Ohio 43560. The written notice to SAJRD shall be addressed and delivered to 7060 Sylvania Avenue, Sylvania, Ohio 43560.
- 3. <u>Assignment</u>. SAJRD shall not assign this Lease without the prior written consent of the CITY, nor shall SAJRD use or permit the use of said property for other than park and/or pool related recreation purposes as hereinabove stated.
- 4. <u>Property Taxes</u>. Currently, the property is tax exempt for real property taxes, if any status is changed as a result of SAJRD's operation, SAJRD shall be responsible for payment of real property taxes resulting from its operation.
- 5. Repairs and Replacements. SAJRD shall be responsible for 100% of repair and/or replacement costs, except that if the cost of repairs or replacements exceed the budgeted repairs and replacements for any fiscal years during the Lease, the City shall reimburse SAJRD for the expenses in any one fiscal year exceeding the sum of \$10,000, with the understanding that the costs of operating and maintaining the pool will be included in a future SAJRD levy. It is SAJRD's intent that the pool's operation and maintenance will be funded by a levy as soon as is practicable.
- 6. <u>Maintenance</u>. SAJRD will be responsible for all operation, care and maintenance of the property, except snow and ice removal in the parking areas. The CITY will provide for snow and ice removal in the parking areas. SAJRD shall also be responsible for all utility bills and pool maintenance expenses, with the exception that the CITY will provide water at no cost to fill the pool one time at the beginning of the season during the initial term of this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Security/Life Guards</u>. SAJRD will be responsible for any and all necessary security and/or life guards that may be required as a result of the use of the property for pool recreation.
- 8. <u>Admission Fees</u>. Any and all admission fees shall be collected and retained by SAJRD. Any additional revenue or fees generated by the improvements to the property shall also be collected and retained by SAJRD.
- 9. <u>Insurance</u>. SAJRD shall maintain general liability insurance on the property, the minimum limits of which shall be One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence, and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in the aggregate.
- 10. <u>Indemnification</u>. SAJRD shall hold the CITY harmless from any and all claims and demands by any person or persons arising from the failure of SAJRD to perform any obligation of this Lease and arising from any occurrence during SAJRD's use of said property. SAJRD shall

maintain the CITY as an additional insured on SAJRD's liability insurance policy for said property provided SAJRD's insurer is agreeable to same.

The CITY shall hold SAJRD harmless from and against any and all claims and demands by any person or persons arising from the failure of the CITY to perform any obligation arising under this Lease Agreement.

- 11. <u>Non-discrimination</u>. SAJRD agrees that it will refrain from all discriminatory actions based on race, sex or religion in dealing with patrons or employees at the Property.
- 12. <u>Cancellation</u>. Either party may terminate this Lease upon twelve (12) months written notice to the other party. Notice of cancellation by SAJRD shall be sent to: Clerk of Council, City of Sylvania, 6730 Monroe St., Sylvania, OH 43560/. Notice of cancellation by the City shall be sent to: SAJRD, 7060 Sylvania Avenue, Sylvania, Ohio 43560.
- 13. Return of Property. SAJRD shall cease the use of the property at the end of the agreed term if not renewed or at the end of the renewal term in as good condition as the property is, reasonable wear, tear and unavoidable casualty excepted. It is agreed that any improvements added or made shall remain with the property.
- 14. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the matters set forth herein. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio. This Agreement may be executed in one complete copy hereof.

During the existence of this agreement or any renewal or extension thereof, CITY shall not assign or otherwise dispose of its interest in this agreement or its real estate described on Exhibit A without the written consent of SAJRD or any successor in interest to SAJRD.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

At the March 21, 2022 meeting City Council authorized the Service Department to request Letters of Interest (LOI's) from consultants to provide engineering services for the design of recommended safety and congestion mitigation measures on Harroun Road by installing a traffic signal and added turning lanes at a realigned intersection of Flower Hospital's main entrance with Ravine Drive.

During the solicitation we received LOI's from two (2) engineering consultants. The Service Department reviewed, scored, and ranked the LOI's and selected DGL Consulting Engineers, LLC as the most highly qualified consultant for this project. Subsequently, the Service Department entered into scope of services and fee negotiations with DGL.

We have completed those negotiations and DGL has prepared a proposal in the amount of \$89,994 to complete the requested scope of services. Their scope of services include survey, preparation of construction plans and right-of-way plans, and geotechnical engineering by TTL Associates. The Service Department will return to City Council to request additional proposal approvals for right-of-way acquisition services once the right-of-way needs on the project are more defined.

This is a Local Public Agency (LPA) project with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). As such the Service Department has coordinated the scope of services and fee proposal with ODOT District 2 and both entities are ready to move forward and commence engineering design. This is an appropriated item in the 2022 budget, fund 223-7611-53503. We would recommend approval of the proposal in the amount of \$89,994 with DGL Consulting Engineers. Scope of Services

Background

DGL understands that the City of Sylvania is planning improvements at the Harroun Rd. and Ravine Drive intersection including the relocation of the Flower Hospital main entrance. Harroun Rd. provides access to ProMedica Flower Hospital. Traffic is especially heavy during shift changes which has led to crash issues at the Harroun Rd. & Ravine Drive intersection and the existing Harroun Rd. & Hospital Drive intersection. These two intersections are approximately 350' apart. Realignment of Hospital Dr. to Ravine Dr. provides one common intersection. A signal at this upgraded intersection will be provided. Ravine Drive will also be widened for the addition of a left turn lane and aligning this lane with the left turn out of the new Flower Hospital main entrance. Harroun Rd. will be resurfaced throughout the project limits to allow for restriping.

Scope of Work

Preliminary/Stage 2 Design

Upon authorization, DGL will perform a field survey to identify all existing topography, centerline controls, right of way limits and existing utility locations. Early communication with the utility companies within the project limits will be one of the first tasks. DGL is aware of how this is vital to a successful project. Geotechnical services will be performed by TTL Associates. Plan development will follow the ODOT plan development process. All roadway, signal and traffic control design will adhere to ODOT standards and guidelines. A construction cost estimate will be prepared and submitted along with the Stage 2 plans.

Upon approval of the Stage 2 design, construction limits will be finalized and right of way plan development will begin. A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AND ENDORSEMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TO THE ONEOHIO RECOVERY FOUNDATION REGION 4 BOARD; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in March 2020, the State of Ohio and local governments throughout the State banded together to create The OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), a one-of-a-kind in the Nation, agreement giving Ohio's Local Governments (counties, townships, cities and villages) a direct role in directing Opioid Funds to implement strategies for community recovery from the opioid crisis;

WHEREAS, the OneOhio MOU establishes a mechanism to disburse settlement proceeds from opioid litigation into Ohio's communities to help abate the opioid crisis through investment in programs that address prevention, treatment, recovery, public awareness, criminal justice and other crucial services;

WHEREAS, a component of The OneOhio MOU establishes a statewide foundation (OneOhio Recovery Foundation) and regional boards to distribute portions of settlement funds;

WHEREAS, the geographic boundaries of Lucas County are designated as Region 4 of the OneOhio Recovery Foundation; and

WHEREAS, as a region, Lucas County (Region 4) is to establish a regional board to designate recipients of regional foundation allocations and to appoint a representative to the statewide OneOhio Recovery Foundation.

RESOLUTION NO. 8 -2022

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SYLVANIA URGING GOVERNOR MIKE DEWINE AND THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("ODOT") TO RECONSIDER ITS DECISION TO END THE ROUTE 23 CONNECT STUDY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, leaders in our region were encouraged when ODOT announced in 2021 that it would conduct the Route 23 Connect Study to determine the feasibility of a free-flowing connection between the Toledo and Columbus regions; and,

WHEREAS, this project is a priority for our regional partner organizations, and we are disappointed in the decision of ODOT to end the study more than a year early without plans for a long-term solution for improved travel on this corridor; and,

WHEREAS, a free-flowing connection between northwest Ohio and Columbus would allow our businesses to benefit from economic development occurring in central Ohio; and,

WHEREAS, improvements to this route will also support the northwest Ohio's economy by providing central Ohio businesses and consumers with better access to markets in northwest Ohio and beyond, and ease of travel to our recreation and tourism experiences; and,

WHEREAS, this corridor is the only connection linking an Ohio metro city with Columbus that requires travelers to go through 38 stoplights between Waldo and the I-270 beltway around Columbus; and,

WHEREAS, research shows that over the next 20 years central Ohio is expected to grow by more than a million households and a million jobs, and options to improve safety and travel times on this corridor will only become more limited with this growth; and,

WHEREAS, the planned opening of the Gordie Howe International Bridge in 2024 will create economic opportunities for Ohio, and plans are needed to improve this route to avoid interrupting the flow of commerce and exports between Ohio and Canada; and,

WHEREAS, this route is an important component of the anticipated extension of the I-73/I-74/I-75 corridor, and increasing congestion will impeded the movement of travelers and goods between Ohio and the southeastern United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, ____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That northwest Ohio and the State of Ohio would benefit from a free-flowing connection to Columbus, and the Council of the City of Sylvania urges ODOT to reconsider its decision to end the Route 23 Connect Study and work with our regional leaders to identify a long-term solution.

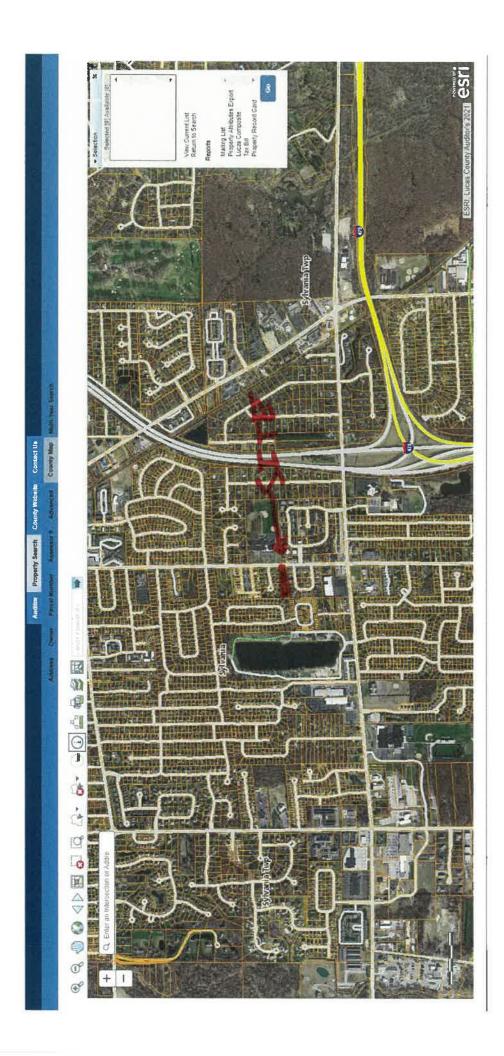
