

Re: MAPLEWOOD AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION COUNCIL CHANGE ORDER NO. 2

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

This change order request contains two changed scope of work items that differ from the awarded contract for the ongoing Maplewood Avenue Reconstruction Project. In summary:

- Project Change Order #2 The Contractor discovered an error while purchasing materials for the decorative concrete planters. The vendor quoted smaller material than the plans specified to all bidding contractors. The Contractor and vendor worked in good faith to reconcile the issue, but the Contractor would not be able to install the planters at the unit price bid without an adjustment. This change order reflects a unit price correction, as well as a quantity reduction, to eliminate one planter. This resulted in a reduction of \$6,150.00 to the contract.
- Project Change Order #4 Unsuitable subsoils were anticipated with the project, but the approach specified in the construction plans needed changed based on observed field conditions. The Contractor, Construction Engineer, and Service Department, all agreed to increase the substandard soil removal from 12" to 18", and switch from a smaller aggregate backfill to a large aggregate capped with smaller aggregate backfill approach, for those areas in need of treatment. This resulted in an increase of \$12,726.10 to the contract.

The total net cost of the Project Change Order #2 reduction (\$6,150.00) and Project Change Order #4 increase (\$12,726.10) is \$6,576.10. As a result, we would recommend approval of Change Order No. 2, which will increase the contract amount from \$693,181.29 (approved May 16, 2022 via Ord. 52-5022) to \$699,757.39. planters. After the bids were submitted, Wausau informed HSX that they made an error in their quote and the corrected quote was substantially higher. HSX worked in good faith with Wausau to reconcile the issue. The initial Wausau quote was \$59,173 for 385 total feet of planters/benches. The final quote was \$69,376 for only 325 total feet.

At the time that Helms & Sons (HSX) was preparing their bid for the project, they received a quote from Wausau Mfg for straight, radius and bench

HSX asked the City if they could help share the cost and the City asked American Structurepoint (ASI) for a recommendation. ASI suggested to split out the labor/profit and overhead (LPO) component from the material cost. The LPO should remain constant as it was bid. Then the City could split the increase in material cost 50/50 with HSX if desired. ASI asked if the City was in agreement to only install the 325' quoted to which the City said they were as the non-performance of bubble LA-5 would create more space on the north sidewalk

In a 4/11/2022 email the City agreed to adjust the unit cost to \$295/foot for approximately 325-feet of total planter/bench installation (nonperform LA-5). The new unit cost is based on the calculations below:

Original Ouote:

385' @ \$265/ft = \$102,025

which can be broken down to:

\$59,173 - material (\$153.70/ft)

\$42,852 - labor/OH/profit (\$111.30/ft)

The labor/OH/profit should remain constant as-bid no matter how many feet are installed.

FOR THE MAPLEWOOD AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT FOR ADDITIONAL WORK PERFORMED; INCREASING THE CONTRACT AMOUNT BY \$6,576.10; APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 36-2022, passed March 21, 2022, accepted the bid of Helms and Sons Excavating, Inc. and awarded the contract for the Maplewood Avenue Improvement Project to same, which bid was in the amount of \$684,211.20; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 52-2022, passed June 1, 2022, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to approve Change Order No. 1 to this City's Agreement with Helms and Sons Excavating, Inc. and increased the contract amount by \$8,970.09 to \$693,181.29; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated June 6, 2022, has recommended acceptance of Change Order No. 2 of Helms and Sons Excavating, Inc. for said Maplewood Avenue Reconstruction Project to reflect two changed scope of work items that differ from the awarded contract, the first involves an error with the price quoted by the vendor for the decorative concrete planters so the unit price was corrected and one planter was eliminated and the second item involves a change to the approach specified in the construction plans for dealing with unsuitable subsoils resulting in increasing the substandard soil removal from 12" to 18" and switching from a smaller aggregate backfill to a large aggregate capped with smaller aggregate backfill approach; and,

WHEREAS, the changed scope of work items resulted in a net increase to the contract in the amount of Six Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Six and 10/100 Dollars (\$6,576.10), for a total contract amount of \$699,757.39.

Re: Design-Build Letter of Interest Solicitation & Public Involvement Meeting Request Richards Park Stream Restoration Project

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

On November 15, 2021 the Service Department requested Council authorization to pursue H2Ohio grant funds for stream mitigation work in Tenmile Creek upstream from the Bonniebrook Road bridge (Res. 17-2021). As a reminder, the \$1,485,000 project would realign over 1,500 feet of stream channel to include more gradual changes of direction and place natural in-stream structures to reduce ongoing streambank erosion issues.

The Service Department has been notified by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) that the 100% grant request was successful. The next step in the process is to formally request Letters of Interest (LOI's) from qualified design-build teams. The Service Department will review the LOI's, select the most qualified team, and enter into fee negotiations with the goal of having the selected team ready to initiate work by August 2022.

In addition, the Service Department would like to engage adjacent property owners early on in this project. The Service Department would like to hold an informational meeting to briefly present the project and answer questions. We suggest this meeting be held in an appropriately assigned Council Committee. Once the Committee meeting date has been set, the Service Department will send out property owner letters and formally invite them to the meeting.

We would recommend authorization to begin the LOI solicitation process and request a Committee meeting date to be set. Please call if you have any questions.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

In August 2021, City Council authorized the Service Department to apply for competitive Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI) grant funds administered by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) to continue our stream restoration work in Harroun Park (Res. 9-2021).

As a reminder, the Phase 2 project is located east of the pedestrian bridge (where Tenmile Creek becomes the Ottawa River) and west of Harroun Road. The Phase 2 project would continue the Phase 1 efforts installed west of the bridge and restore an additional 1,000 feet of streambank and install six (6) J-Hook structures placed at 200-foot intervals. Other project components include six (6) constructed riffles and 700 feet of toewood for streambank reinforcement.

The total project cost is \$702,000 and the Service Department requested \$600,000 in grant funding assistance from GLRI. The local match contribution was \$102,000. The Service Department was notified in May that our application and \$600,000 grant request was successful.

The next step in the process is to formally request Letters of Interest (LOI's) from qualified design-build teams. The Service Department will review the LOI's, select the most qualified team, and enter into fee negotiations with the goal of having the selected team ready to initiate work by August 2022.

We would request approval to begin the Design/Build solicitation process. Please call with any questions.

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service has recommended to Council the removal or special treatment of shade trees and for planting, maintaining, trimming and removing shade trees in and along the streets and within public right-of-way of the City of Sylvania during the year 2022 in accordance with plans, estimates and schedules therefore heretofore prepared and now on file in the Office of the Clerk of Council.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby declared necessary and conducive to public health, convenience and welfare to remove and provide special treatment for shade trees for the purpose of controlling blight and disease of same, and for planting, maintaining, trimming and removing shade trees in and along the streets and within public right-of-way of the City of Sylvania during the year 2022. That for said purpose there is hereby established one (1) district which shall include all territory within and coextensive with the boundaries of the City of Sylvania, pursuant to the provisions of Section 727.011 of the Revised Code of Ohio.

SECTION 2. That the work of such removal or special treatment of shade trees for the purpose of controlling blight and disease of same and for planting, maintaining, trimming and removing shade trees in and along the streets and within public right-of-way of the City of Sylvania shall be done within said district, as herein set forth, and through the proper officers of the City of Sylvania; and such officers be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to purchase required materials; to purchase or rent the necessary tools, machinery and appliances; to employ the necessary labor to do said work all in accordance with the plans, estimates and schedules therefore heretofore prepared and now on file in the Office of the Clerk of Council for inspection of all persons interested, which said plans, estimates and schedules, including approximate present estimates of the cost of said work, is in the aggregate sum of Two Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety-Three Dollars and 00/100 (\$249,993.00).

SECTION 3. That said cost and expense of removal or special treatment of shade trees for the purpose of controlling blight and disease of same and for planting, maintaining, trimming and removing shade trees in and along the streets and within public right-of-way of the City of Sylvania in the amount of Two Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety-Three Dollars and 00/100 (\$249,993.00) shall be specially assessed by the front foot upon all of the lots and lands abutting and bounding upon each of said streets and public right-of-way in said district in the amount of thirty-five cents (35ϕ) per front foot as provided in Section 727.011 of the Ohio Revised Code, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefitted by said work in the amount equal to the amount specially assessed against each such lot and land. The cost of said work shall include acquisition of the necessary materials, tools, machinery and appliances, the wages for the necessary labor, the cost of said plans, estimates and schedules, cost of publication and mailing of notices, and cost of this Ordinance, costs of the preparation, levy and collection of special assessments and interest on notes issued in anticipation of the levy and collection of the special assessments together with all other necessary expenditures.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> That the special assessment so to be levied on said lots and lands shall be paid in one (1) installment in the manner provided in the case of special assessments pursuant to Section 727.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> That to provide a fund out of which shall be paid the assessed cost and expense of said work, bonds or notes or certificate of indebtedness of the City of Sylvania are hereby authorized to be issued and sold in anticipation of the levy and collection of said assessments.

SECTION 6. That the Director of Finance has prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Council a list of the special assessments, pursuant to this Ordinance, and this Council finds and determines that such special assessments are in proportion to the special benefit derived by each property against which such assessments are to be levied and are not in excess of any statutory limitation.

SECTION 7. That, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 727.14, the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to give notice of the passage of this Ordinance by publication of such notice once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks, and as to an owner of any lot or parcel of land the assessment upon which is estimated to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to serve such notice in the same manner as service of summons in civil cases, or by certified mail addressed to such owner at his last known address or to the address to which tax bills are sent, or by a combination of the foregoing methods. Objections to estimated assessments must be filed, in writing with the Clerk of Council within two (2) weeks after completion of the notice hereby required. An owner who fails to file an objection shall be deemed to have waived any objection. Any and all properly filed objections to estimated

assessments shall be considered by Council at its first regular Council meeting held more than two (2) weeks after the completion of the notice hereby required and the estimated assessments so objected to shall at such meeting, be adjusted by Council by motion or other action reflected in the journal of the minutes of Council. Council, after adjusting such estimated assessments or, after the time for filing objections without any properly filed objections having been timely filed, may, by Ordinance, levy such estimated assessments and adjusted estimated assessments, as the case may be. No notice shall be required other than as herein required.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> That the method, manner, consideration and procedure for such shade tree work is hereby approved and this Council hereby determines the method, manner and procedure for levying assessments for such shade tree work to be as set forth in this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 10. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 11. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that provision should be made immediately to provide for tree maintenance and therefore this Ordinance should be effective forthwith. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

That the work of such construction, maintaining, repairing, cleaning and enclosing open drainage ditches located within the district of the City shall be done within said district, as herein set forth, and through the proper officers of the City of Sylvania; and such officers be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to purchase required materials; to purchase or rent the necessary tools, machinery and appliances; to employ the necessary labor to do said work all in accordance with the plans, estimates and schedules therefore heretofore

prepared and now on file in the Office of the Clerk of Council for inspection of all persons interested, which said plans, estimates and schedules, including approximate present estimates of the cost of said work, is in the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Sixteen Thousand, Four Hundred Nine Dollars and 00/100 (\$316,409.00).

SECTION 3. RESOLUTION NO. 6 -2022

DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF LIGHTING THE STREETS IN THE CITY OF SYLVANIA, OHIO; DETERMINING THE MANNER OF PROVIDING STREET LIGHTING AND THE BASIS FOR THE PROPERTY OWNER'S SHARE OF THE COST AND ANNUAL ASSESSMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _______
members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That is hereby determined to be necessary to continue to improve the streets in the City of Sylvania, Ohio, by lighting the same pursuant to a contract therefore which this City now has with the Toledo Edison Company and necessary to provide funds in 2022 for such street lighting.

SECTION 2. That for the tax year 2022 the basis for determining and allocating annual assessments on lots and lands in said City for street lighting in the City of Sylvania, Ohio, shall be as follows, which basis is hereby determined to be according to the benefits which may result from the improvements to the several parcels and lots of land in said City:

- E. Each taxable parcel, outside of the Whiteway Business District, having no building or buildings thereon, served by lamps on poles with either overhead or underground circuits, shall be assessed a front footage charge of 16¢ for each benefitted front foot of the parcel;
- O. Each taxable parcel, outside of the Whiteway Business District, having a building or buildings thereon, served by lamps on poles with overhead circuits, shall be assessed a front footage charge of 50¢ for each benefitted front foot of the parcel;
- U. Each taxable parcel, outside of the Whiteway Business District, having a building or buildings thereon, served by lamps on poles with underground circuits, shall be assessed a front footage charge of 88¢ for each benefitted front foot of the parcel;
- W. Each taxable parcel, within the Whiteway Business District, fronting on Main Street, Maplewood Avenue, or Monroe Street, being served by lamps on poles with either overhead or underground circuits, shall be assessed at a rate of \$1.13 per front foot of the parcel;

SECTION 3. That the contract with the Toledo Edison company and the costs to this City required thereby, now on file with the Clerk of Council, are hereby deemed to be the plans and specifications and estimate of cost required to be on file with the Clerk of Council before the passage of the Resolution of necessity.

- SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council has prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Council a list of the estimated special assessments for the cost and expense of street lighting in the City of Sylvania, which list shows the amounts of the estimated assessment against each taxable parcel in the City of Sylvania, pursuant to Section 2 of this Resolution, and the amount of such assessments in the aggregate, and this Council finds and determines that such estimated assessments are in proportion to the special benefit derived by each property against which such assessments are to be levied and are not in excess of any statutory limitation.
- SECTION 5. That, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 727.14, the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to give notice of the passage of this Resolution by publication of such notice once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks, and as to an owner of any lot or parcel of land the assessment upon which is estimated to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), the clerk of Council is hereby directed to serve such notice in the same manner as service of summons in civil cases, or by certified mail addressed to such owner at his last known address or to the address to which tax bills are sent, or by a combination of the foregoing methods. - SECTION 8. That this Resolution shall be published by posting a copy thereof in a conspicuous place in the Sylvania Municipal Building for a period of not less than fifteen (15) days as provided in ARTICLE III, Section 12.0 of the Charter of said City.
- SECTION 9. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the reason that proceedings for assessing the cost of the improvement referred to herein are required without delay in order to timely place said assessment upon the tax duplicate for the year. Provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.









