The State of Sylvania is strong. Our budgets are balanced and the recent infusion of federal and state funds have strengthened our financial position. No new taxes have been added. We are fortunate to be able to continue improving our infrastructure with the many projects last year and planned for the coming years. During the last few years, we have been awarded almost \$40 million of construction grants, which we started using last year and will continue spending over the next few years.
