Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

At the January 16, 2024 meeting City Council authorized the Service Department to request Letters of Interest (LOI's) from consultants to provide engineering services for Silvertown Drive Waterline Improvements & Resurfacing Project. The scope of work includes replacing the 8" cast iron waterline installed in 1965 with a new ductile iron, or, plastic pipe of the same size, new water services, and asphalt resurfacing from Monroe Street to Alexis Road.

During the solicitation we received LOI's from four (4) engineering consultants. The Service Department reviewed, scored, and ranked the LOI's and selected Fishbeck as the most highly qualified firm. We subsequently entered into scope of services and fee negotiations with Fishbeck and have been provided a proposal in the amount of \$64,500 to complete the scope of work.

The anticipated engineering fees were included in the 2024 budget and would be funded from the 701-7525-53501 account.

We would recommend approval of the proposal from Fishbeck in the amount of \$64,500. Please call if you should have any questions.

ORDINANCE NO. 77-2024

ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF FISHBECK TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING AND SURVEYING SERVICES FOR THE SILVERTOWN DRIVE WATERLINE IMPROVEMENTS & RESURFACING PROJECT; APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$64,500; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, at the January 16, 2024 meeting of Sylvania City Council, the Director of Public Service was authorized to begin consultant letter of interest solicitation from engineering consultants to design and prepare necessary construction plans for the Silvertown Drive Waterline Improvements and Resurfacing Project; and,

WHEREAS, the project includes replacing the 8" cast iron waterline installed in 1965 with a new ductile iron, or, plastic pipe of the same size, new water services, and asphalt resurfacing from Monroe Street to Alexis Road; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Service received Letters of Interest from four engineering consultants and after reviewing, scoring and ranking the consultants, selected Fishbeck as the most highly qualified firm; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated June 3, 2024, has recommended that the proposal of Fishbeck in the amount of \$64,500 for the professional engineering and surveying services relative to the Silvertown Drive Waterline Improvements and Resurfacing Project be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That the proposal of Fishbeck in the amount of Sixty-Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$64,500.00) for providing professional engineering and surveying services for the Silvertown Drive Waterline Improvements and Resurfacing Project, is hereby approved and accepted.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> That the Director of Public Service shall promptly give notice to said engineers to proceed under the proposal hereby approved and accepted.

SECTION 3. That to provide funds for said engineering services hereby authorized, there is hereby appropriated from the **WATER FUND** from funds therein not heretofore appropriated to **Account No. 701-7525-53501** – **Utility Improvements** the amount of Sixty-Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$64,500.00).

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 6. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the City should provide for the engineering services for the Silvertown Drive Waterline Improvement & Resurfacing Project at the earliest possible time. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

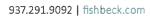

ORDINANCE NO. 78-2024

REVISING THE ADMINISTRATIVE, DEPARTMENTAL AND DIVISIONAL ORGANIZATION OF THE CITY AND THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES THEREOF BY AMENDING SYLVANIA CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 139.03(d)(3) – DEFINITION AND ADOPTION OF THE COMPENSATION PLAN TO ADJUST THE CLERK OF COURTS' SALARY FROM \$71,720 ANNUALLY TO \$60,000 ANNUALLY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Judge of the Sylvania Municipal Court has requested that the salary for the Clerk of Courts contained in Sylvania Codified Ordinance Section 139.03(d)(3) be decreased from \$71,720 annually effective January 1, 2024 to \$60,000 annually effective June 4, 2024.

SECTION 1. That Section 139.03(d)(3) of the Codified Ordinances of Sylvania, 1979, as amended, be and it is, hereby further amended to read as set forth on the attached "Exhibit A" effective on and after June 4, 2024.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the amendment to this Chapter should be provided for immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by this Charter.

Re: Sylvania River Trail Murals

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The Service Department has been discussing beautification of the US-23 bridge piers adjacent to the Sylvania River Trail for several years. There is one pier available at this time for beautification (northbound US-23 mainline). Once improvements to the US-23/Monroe Street interchange project are completed in 2026 there will be three additional piers available for beautification (southbound US-23 mainline, southbound US-23 on ramp and northbound US-23 off ramp).

The Northview and Southview High School art departments have developed proposed mural concepts for the northbound US-23 mainline pier. A packet of concepts was provided to the Sylvania Arts Commission for review and recommendation and is provided for your informational purposes. The "short wall" in the packet refers to the northbound US-23 mainline pier.

The Arts Commission is recommending Option #3, but is requesting the cardinal and deer be hand painted instead of "clip art".

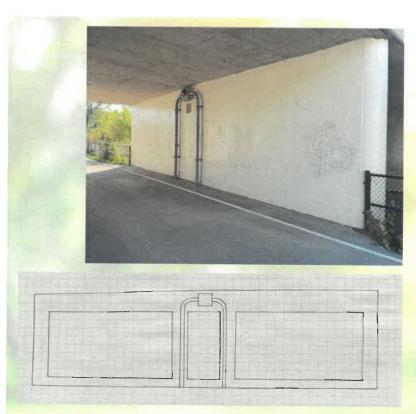
