Re: Professional Engineering Services Proposal for Overhead Utility Relocation Engineering Downtown Transportation Improvements (Phase 2)

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

At the October 2, 2023 Committee of the Whole meeting the Service Department discussed several aspects of the Downtown Transportation Improvement Project including project phasing, preliminary cost estimates, and grant funding opportunities. It was recommended the Service Department continue project development into two phases (Phase 1 and Phase 2) on the basis of better opportunities to secure grant funding and to allow more time to bury overhead electric and telecommunication utilities in the 2nd block of Main Street.

Since that meeting the Service Department has been diligently working with utility companies to better understand what requirements and construction plans would be necessary to accomplish the relocation. The utility companies are requesting the City develop one common set of construction plans whereby all underground facilities to house each facility would be included in one contract.

The project design engineer (DGL Consulting Engineers) and their electrical subconsultant (JDRM) have prepared an overhead utility relocation engineering proposal in the amount of \$73,534 to prepare construction plans and specifications for the relocation work. It would be the goal to construct the Phase 1 roadway contract and the Phase 2 utility bury contract simultaneously in 2025. We would recommend approval of the DGL/JDRM engineering proposal in the amount of \$73,534. Funds for the engineering design would be from the project capital account, 402-7610-53501. ORDINANCE NO. 80-2024

ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF DGL CONSULTING ENGINEERS TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR OVERHEAD UTILITY RELOCATION ENGINEERING FOR THE DOWNTOWN TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS (PHASE 2) PROJECT; APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$73,534; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, at the October 2, 2023 Committee-of-the-Whole meeting, the Director and Deputy Director of Public Service provided an update on the Downtown Transportation Improvement Project and requested input and guidance relative to the phasing of the project development and, thereafter, the Committee-of-the-Whole Council recommended that the Director of Public Service proceed with developing the project in two phases in order to potentially secure more grant funding and to allow more time to bury overhead electric and telecommunications utilities along Main Street from Maplewood Avenue to Erie Street; and,

WHEREAS, the affected utility companies have requested that the City develop one common set of construction plans whereby all underground facilities to house each facility would be included in one contract; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated June 17, 2024, has received a proposal from DGL to provide professional engineering services to prepare construction plans and specifications for the relocation work for overhead utility relocation engineering for the Downtown Transportation Improvements (Phase 2) Project at a cost of \$73,534, and the Director of Public Service has recommended approval of that proposal.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the proposal of DGL Consulting Engineers in the amount of Seventy-Three Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Four Dollars (\$73,534.00) to provide professional engineering services for overhead utility relocation engineering for the Downtown Transportation Improvements (Phase 2) Project is hereby approved and accepted.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> That the Director of Public Service shall promptly give notice to said engineers to proceed under the proposal hereby approved and accepted.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> That to provide funds for said professional engineering services hereby authorized, there is hereby appropriated from the **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND** from funds therein not heretofore appropriated to **Account No. 402-7610-53501 – Downtown Transportation Improvements** an amount not to exceed Seventy-Three Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Four Dollars (\$73,534.00)

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 6. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the professional engineering services should commence at the earliest possible time and therefore this Ordinance should be effective immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

Scope of Services

Scope of Work

The Scope of Services was defined at the Scope of Engineering Work Review Meeting 05-02-24 by the City of Sylvania and utility companies as follows:

- DGL to survey from Maplewood to Erie to pick up all property meter boxes.
- DGL to update existing base mapping.
- JDRM will provide construction plans for the relocation of the overhead utilities including all required notes and details.
- DGL will provide MOT plans that coordinate with the downtown Transportation Improvement project.
- Right-of-Way plans for temporary, proposed, and/or easements are not included with this proposal and a future proposal will be provided if Right-of-Way services are required.

The **DGL** itemized fee proposal is provided in Appendix A. This proposal is itemized using a typical ODOT fee spreadsheet and provides individual task items with assumed hours. ODOT's fee guidance was utilized in determining the hours. A low to medium complexity rating was assumed for most tasks.

The **JDRM fee proposal is provided in Appendix B**. JDRM will be providing the construction plans for the relocation of the overhead utilities to underground.

Schedule

The anticipated schedule is that plans will be prepared for a January bidding.



ORDINANCE NO. 81-2024

ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ASSESSMENTS HERETOFORE AUTHORIZED BY RESOLUTION NO. 6-2024 FOR STREET LIGHTING; LEVYING SAID ASSESSMENTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council by Resolution No. 6-2024, passed May 6, 2024, declared the necessity for lighting the municipal streets, determined the basis for levying annual assessments on lots and lands in this City for such purpose, and authorized such assessments in the amount as estimated by the Finance Department, pursuant to said Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the Finance Department pursuant to said Resolution and Revised Code Section 727.14, gave notice of the passage of said Resolution and the filing of such estimated assessments; and,

WHEREAS, no objections were filed pursuant to Revised Code Section 727.15 or such objections as were filed have been considered by Council, and such assessments, as adjusted if adjusted, should be approved, levied and certified to the Auditor of Lucas County, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the assessments for the street lighting authorized by said Resolution in the aggregate amount of Three Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand, Six Hundred Twenty-Five and 97/100 (\$378,625.97) and the assessments, as adjusted if adjusted, are hereby approved an such assessments in the amount so approved are hereby levied on the several parcels and lots of land in said City on the basis as set forth in said Resolution and the Finance Department is hereby directed to certify said assessments to the Auditor of Lucas County, Ohio, within the time provided therefore by the Revised Code of Ohio Section 5705.34.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That the Finance Department is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of Finance in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that immediate provision must be made for lighting the City streets. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

WHEREAS, the Finance Department has given notice of the passage of the Ordinance creating the Tree District for 2024, and of the estimated assessments on file in the Office of Finance; and,

WHEREAS, Council has considered and adjusted all objections to estimated assessments that were properly and timely filed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That, to pay the cost and expense of the removal or special treatment of certain shade trees for the purpose of controlling the blight and disease and for planting, maintaining, trimming and removing of other shade trees in and along the streets and within public right-of-way of the City of Sylvania described in the schedule as reported by the Finance Department for the year ending December 31, 2024, there be, and hereby is assessed, in one (1) installment for 2024, upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the streets and public

right-of-way in said district, the several sums shown in the list of assessments, as adjusted if adjusted, and set opposite the description of the respective lots and lands and do hereby determine and declare that said lots and lands are specially benefitted in the amounts so assessed against the same, which amounts and assessments are hereby confirmed and approved.

- SECTION 2. That the owners of said several lots and parcels of land shall pay the said sum so assessed as above against their said lots and lands, respectively, in one (1) installment, to the Treasurer of Lucas County, Ohio, at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes are paid, or be subject to the penalty and interest to be paid thereon as provided by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 7-2024

WHEREAS, on June 12, 2024, this Council received notice from Leslie B. Brinning that she was the authorized agent for the petitioners of the territory sought to be annexed (Parcel No. 78-14077 on Monroe Street) by the City of Sylvania to the City of Sylvania filed with the Board of Commissioners of Lucas County, Ohio on May 20, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Revised Code of Section 709.03 (D) this Council is required to adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the City of Sylvania will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, _____ members elected thereto concurring:


<u>SECTION 1.</u> That upon annexation to the City of Sylvania the territory proposed to be annexed by said annexation petition will be provided, by the City of Sylvania, with the following services:

- a. Domestic garbage, trash and refuse generated on the premises of each residential property will be removed and disposed of once a week;
- b. Police protection will be furnished by the City of Sylvania;
- c. Street shade trees will be sprayed, trimmed, planted, removed and their leaves and branches disposed of as a part of the City tree program;
- d. Green yard waste pickup will be provided for residential property on a bi-weekly basis during the months of March through November;
- e. Curbside recycling will be provided bi-weekly for single-family residential units;
- f. Storm drainage facilities will be regularly and routinely cleaned and cleared;
- g. The minimum sanitary sewer system value and capital connection charge for future connections will be reduced from \$940 to a charge of \$430 or less;

- h. The maximum sanitary sewer system value and capital connection charge for future connections will be reduced from \$202,100 to a charge of \$92,450;
- i. The territory described in the petition is within the Sylvania Sewer and Water Districts;
- j. Snow plowing will be provided for public streets;
- k. Street sweeping will be provided for public streets;
- 1. Site plan, preliminary and final plat review and approvals will be provided.
- m. The above services will be provided within six months after the date of the granting of the annexation petition.
- n. If a street or highway will be divided or segmented by the boundary line between the township and the municipal corporation as to create a road maintenance problem, the municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed has agreed as a condition of the an annexation to assume the maintenance of that street or highway or to otherwise correct the problem. As used in this section, "street" or "highway" has the same meaning as in section 4511.01 of the Revised Code.
- o. If the municipal zoning permits uses in the annexed territory that the municipal corporation determines are clearly incompatible with the uses permitted under current county or township zoning regulations in the adjacent land remaining within the township from which the territory was annexed, the legislative authority of the municipal corporation will require, in the zoning ordinance permitting the incompatible uses, the owner of the annexed territory to provide a buffer separating the use of the annexed territory and the adjacent land remaining within the township. For the purposes of this section, "buffer" includes open space, landscaping, fences, walls, and other structured elements; streets and street rights-of-way; and bicycle and pedestrian paths and sidewalks.
- SECTION 2. That the Clerk of this Council shall file with the Board of Commissioners of Lucas County, Ohio a certified copy of this Resolution and shall also provide petitioners with a certified copy of this Resolution.
- SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Resolution in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The bidding documents for the above referenced project are complete and the Service Department will be moving forward with the Plans, Specifications, and Estimate (PS&E) package to ODOT District 2 at the end of this month.

The scope of work includes implementing the recommended safety and congestion mitigation measures on Harroun Road by installing a traffic signal and added turning lanes at a realigned intersection of Flower Hospital's main entrance with Ravine Drive.

The estimated construction cost is \$1,479,119 of which \$468,734 (31.7%) is being funded by an Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) grant, \$673,250 (45.5%) is being funded by a Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Grant (CMAQ) through the Ohio Department of Transportation, and ProMedica Flower Hospital will be contributing \$100,000 (6.8%). The remaining \$237,135 (16.0%) will be locally funded.

This is a programmed capital improvement expense for 2024 with funding from account 401-7610-53609. The Service Department will advertise for bids beginning on August 12, 2024 with a bid opening scheduled for September 4, 2024. Construction can start after October 1, 2024 and must be completed by September 30, 2025.

We would request that the Clerk of Council be authorized to advertise for bids.
