Community Affairs

Introduction

Officer Russell completed the elementary L.E.A.D. curriculum and held L.E.A.D. graduation ceremonies at Highland Elementary and Toledo Islamic Academy. Officer Russell also provided kindergarten bike safety and 3rd grade seatbelt safety talks to Sylvania's Public Elementary Schools, St. Joseph School, and Toledo Islamic Academy.

This concludes the first full school year that Community Affairs has taught the Law Enforcement Against Drugs curriculum in replacement of the D.A.R.E. curriculum. The new curriculum appeared to be a big hit with the students and multiple teachers commented about the improvements over the old D.A.R.E. program.

Officer Andrzejewski and Officer Barnswell finished the second half of the 2024-2025 school year at Northview High School and Southview High School without any major issues. The City of Sylvania Police Division, the Sylvania Township Police Division, and the Sylvania School District continue to utilize a cooperative effort to maintain school safety in the district.

The Community Affairs staff coordinated and conducted the Safety City Program at Maplewood Elementary this year. The program was a success and continues to receive positive responses from parents and children involved in the program. This was the first year since Sgt. Bell took over where the classes were full and no one canceled before the week of the event.

The Sylvania Public Safety Cadets continues to be an excellent resource for our community. The program provides the opportunity for our youth to learn about law enforcement as they develop lifelong skills that will serve them well as they become adults.

- Officer Barnswell attended the monthly Sylvania Prevention Alliance meetings.
- Officer Russell and Sylvania Township Sgt. Bostater continued to organize and run the Public Safety Cadet meetings.


