### Administrative Update

During the 3rd quarter of 2025, Austin Bly was appointed to the position of Police Officer with our department. Officer Bly comes to us from Toledo Police Department with 6 years of

experience. This brings our officer count to 26 of the 27 authorized.

The two 2025 cruisers that were ordered have been delivered and upfitted. Both have been put in service with the road patrol. One older unit was retained for assignment to the officers at court while the other will be disposed of through Gov Deals.

The L.E.A.D. program has begun working with the Sylvania Advantage to have a “Paws for Safety” article with Leo the Lab giving Safety Tip updates for kids and families. Leo made his first appearance at the Sylvania Northview/Southview football game.

The department also purchased four (4) Aventon E-bikes for our Bike Patrol Unit. We were able to host an E-Bike training at our department. All seven of our bike patrol officers attended as well as four officers from Waterville PD.

In September, two officers were reassigned from Road Patrol to Court Officer positions. These officers are assigned to court security at Sylvania Municipal Court as well as serving court paperwork within the City of Sylvania. If the officers are not needed at the court, they are available to assist road patrol.

## Community Affairs

Officers from the Community Affairs Division have begun the transition into the 2025-2026 school year, which began August 18<sup>th</sup>. Officer Andrzejewski is continuing his third year as the SRO at Southview High School and Officer Barnswell continuing his second year as Northview High School’s SRO. Officer Russell began teaching the elementary L.E.A.D. curriculum for the for her second year.

The Sylvania Police Volunteer Division has continued to assist with events and on road patrol as needed. Sylvania Police Division Volunteers have assisted with numerous events throughout the community this quarter. The Volunteer Division continues to be a tremendous asset to our Police Division.

The Sylvania Public Safety Cadets continues to be an excellent resource for our community. The program provides the opportunity for our youth to learn about law enforcement as they develop lifelong skills that will serve them well as they become adults.

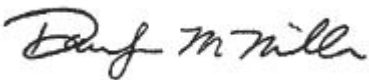
