We have reviewed the above proposed parklet and would recommend its approval subject to the following conditions:


- Applicant will be required to provide snow and ice control in the area around the parklet. This is

#### **ORDINANCE NO.** \_1\_\_-2020

GRANTING A LICENSE TO THE DOWNTOWN SYLVANIA ASSOCIATION TO ENTER A PORTION OF CITY OWNED RIGHT-OF-WAY TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN TWO PARKLETS ON MAIN STREET; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO SIGN THE LICENSE AGREEMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Downtown Sylvania Association has requested a license over two parking spaces along Main Street to install and maintain two parklets; and,

WHEREAS, the granting of said License Agreement as set forth in "Exhibit A" will permit the Downtown Sylvania Association to properly install and maintain two parklets along Main Street.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the License Agreement set forth above as "Exhibit A" is hereby granted and the Mayor and Director of Finance are hereby authorized to evidence the granting of said License Agreement by signing said Agreement on behalf of this City.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the License should be granted forthwith so as to permit the Downtown Sylvania Association to install and maintain two parklets along Main Street at the earliest possible time. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and

approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall to approved by the Mayor or as otherwise prov	ake effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is vided by the Charter.

#### LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement is entered into between the Downtown Sylvania Association (hereafter "DSA"), 5651 Main St., Sylvania, OH 43560 and the City of Sylvania (hereafter "City"), 6730 Monroe Street, Sylvania, OH 43560. The purpose of this License Agreement is to permit the DSA to install two parklets in two parking spaces on either side of the crosswalk on Main Street in downtown Sylvania. The License Agreement is made subject to the conditions set forth below.

#### I. ACCESS

The DSA shall have access to the two parking spaces on the west side of Main Street, one to the North and one to the South of the mid-block crosswalk as shown on the attached "Exhibit A."

#### II. SCOPE OF LICENSE

This License Agreement gives the DSA the right to enter onto the property for the purpose of installing and maintaining two parklets as represented on "Exhibit B – the Parklet Permit Application." This License is non-exclusive and the City expressly reserves the right to access the area as may be necessary.

#### I. MAINTENANCE

That except as otherwise stated herein, the DSA shall maintain the parklets as reflected in "Exhibit B – Parklet Permit Application" during the term of this Agreement or any renewals or extensions thereof including as set forth on the Private Parklet Support and Maintenance Agreement included in the application.

#### II. SITE CONDITION

The DSA shall conduct its activities in a manner so as to minimize the disturbance to existing site conditions. Any disturbance to the property resulting from the DSA's activities shall be repaired or corrected promptly.

#### Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The City has been awarded a Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Sub-Grant for this project at Harroun Park, previously authorized by City Council on March 4, 2019, via Ordinance 4-2019. The plan includes the conversion of the 0.4 acre depression in the interior of the parking lot behind Root Inc. to a bioretention cell to intercept stormwater draining directly to Ten Mile Creek. It also includes a complementary stream restoration component that installs three (3) cross vane and rock riffle structures and riparian plantings along a 350 linear foot stretch of Ten Mile Creek within Harroun Park.

We would like to move forward in obtaining the services of a design-build team to provide professional design construction services for this project. The Project will improve water quality within Ten Mile Creek by 1) detaining and filtering stormwater that currently flows directly to Ten Mile Creek, 2) reducing excess stress and subsequent erosion from streambanks, 3) increasing in-stream habitat for aquatic communities and 4) removing rip-rap and replanting riparian floodplain for additional nutrient and sediment attenuation.

We are requesting that the Clerk of Council be authorized to advertise for Request for Qualifications for Design-Build Service for this project.
